Where: Lookout Mtn. Youth Services Center. 2901 Ford Street, Golden, Colorado. Just South of the roundabout at Johnson Rd. and South Golden Rd.

To get to the race course: As you enter the main drive for the facility, you'll see a dirt road on the left immediately before the entrance gate. Follow the dirt road required to race parking. There is **NO PARKING** on the asphalt. Please honor this so we can keep using this facility.

Licenses: All riders must present an annual or 1-day USAC license. USAC annuals available at usacycling.org. USAC 1-Day @\$15 will be automatically charged at BikeReg when registering. Neither will be sold at race site. Bicycle Colorado annual licensees receive CX Cup points.

Course Preview: Use the bypass lane by the finish line!!! Riders are only allowed on the course when the GREEN FLAG is up.



Only current USAC annual licenses who are USA citizens or permanent residents and who reside in the local association area known as Bicycle Colorado as shown on their license are eligible to compete for the championship title. Riders on UCI professional teams are welcome to race, but are not eligible for championship title, medal, or jersey.
